MISSIONS UPDATE

—PLATEAU PREGNANCEY SERVICES

Plateau Pregnancy Services (PPS) is a local outreach ministry committed to providing abstinence, whole health instruction, counseling and support to women and men in crisis pregnancies and post abortion recovery.

PPS was established in 1992 by Dr. Michael Perrigan who found a need to offer more extensive services to unwed mothers than his own OB/GYN practice could provide. It began as a crisis pregnancy hotline with First Presbyterian Church members and then moved to its present location, donated by Dr. and Mrs. Perrigan, in 1993.

Sheri Nichols, an enthusiastic and dedicated ambassador for Christ, became the Executive Director in 2010. She has a special heart for helping those struggling with drug abuse to get rehab, reclaim their lives and become the best person and/or parent that they can be.

The ministry has grown considerably since its humble beginnings and now provides a variety of services under the following three operating programs.

- Project CARE (Character, Advancement, Respect, Education): includes services directly related to pregnancy
- Project Hope: includes services to help facilitate healing and recovery from the hurts of bad choices and includes confidential support, bible study, and mentoring
- Project Truth: is a Whole Health Sex Education program, teaching abstinence, purity, healthy relationships and consequences of poor choices.




