PASTOR ANDY

Maybe you have heard the expression that the Church is not an organization but an organism. Such an expression is highlighting how the Church is a living thing, dynamic and growing, like an organism. The problem is that any healthy organization shares similar aspects. Indeed, the church is an organization and an organism. She is the living family of God. In fact, the New Testament uses many such word pictures to describe the dynamic growing and living aspects of the Church. She is a body, and she is a bride as well as a family.

All that is to say that a Church must experience the dynamics of a living organism in order to be healthy. As the Church, we need plans, dreams, and hopes. Having set our eyes on Christ in faith, we have received from Him commands and a commission (Matthew 22:34-40; 28:16-20). We live to see them actualized.

In obedience to these commands and this commission, our church is experiencing unprecedented blessing and growth. 2025 has been a tremendous year; all praise to God. But, just to rehearse, we are about to surpass the 150 mark in membership, the largest membership in our history. We have experienced an equal growth financially, which allowed us to complete the renovations to our Christian Education Center debt free. Brothers and Sisters, we still have much to do in front of us, and I wish to use the remainder of this article to ask you to pray about three mission critical matters.

The first is mission focus. Pray and ask God to give the grace of perseverance to our Elders, Deacons, Committees, Teachers and all members to remain focused on our call to glorify God in all things, trust Him for all things, proclaim Him as King over all things, and love Him and others through all things. Session held its regular monthly session meeting on Tuesday morning, May 20, at the church.

- d. Children's classes continue, including use of the First Catechism and hymns of the month.

critical activities of Worship (Up-reach) Discipleship (In-reach) and Evangelism (Out -reach).

The second is a practical concern. Our Session is preparing to hire an assistant pastor to aid us as a congregation in ministering to young families, youth and children. This man will be a second teaching elder to come alongside pastor Andy, Matt, and our Elders and Deacons to lead our congregation in continuing to be faithful to our vision and mission. Please pray for wisdom for our leaders and for the right man to come and help us.

The third is a bit more long-term. We are entering phase 2 of our building program. There are three main goals in the expansion of our main building. Increased seating capacity in the Sanctuary, a larger fellowship hall, and adequate restroom facilities for our growing church. In the days ahead, the Session will be working with the Deacons to identify a committee that can help us determine the right floor plan that has the potential to be cost effective. Then we will work with an Architect to give us a design that does this. We will then be entering a season of gathering the money needed to meet these important needs of our Church. If you want to give to the building fund at any time, you may.

I am so thankful for you. God has shown himself faithful through your faithfulness. Keep loving each other. Be consistent in worship. Sit under God's Word and learn how to walk with Him. Keep reaching out to your neighbors. The gospel is powerful, and our witness to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ has the power to transform our community. God is doing it. Let's keep going. Amen.

MISSIONS UPDATE —LEE LEADBETTER, RUF-I



On April 10th, for the first time in 17+ years, we asked a local church to host our International Dinner & Discovery event. With our normal oncampus venue booked we didn't have another good option...but Redeemer Church turned out to be a great option! RUF-I was birthed out of Redeemer in early 2008 and Redeemer has been a faithful partner since then, supporting our ministry to UT international students in countless ways.

Not only did Redeemer share their newly opened "Commons" space that night, but a Redeemer community group provided and served the delicious meal for students & leaders. This hospitality set the stage for a deeply engaging post-dinner discussion about one of Jesus' parables among our guests that night, which included 5 Muslims & 7 Hindus. Most of those students would likely not have set foot inside a church on a Sunday morning. But because the Church, through a full-time & ordained RUF-I minister and local volunteers, has a stable presence on the UT campus, churches like Redeemer play a significant role in fulfilling Jesus call to "make disciples of all nations.

A new RUF-I leader (Annie Bolton, pictured above on the right), shared this reflection after her first Dinner & Discovery: "I was happily surprised by the friendliness of many of the students and how it was much easier to connect with some of them than expected...I loved how you (all) honored our Nigerian friends, and how much we enjoyed sitting around the table together...I was very impressed by how well [the] discussion questions...really pointed to the heart



of the matter...in leading to meaningful, Gospel -centered truth!

A Community Effort

Our friends from S. Asia just became first-time parents! Last year this sweet Muslim couple was very involved with RUF-I, attending our social activities and also events where they got to explore Christianity in a loving, respectful "space." Well, they just celebrated the birth of their first child, which is why we saw our friends less and less over the past 9 months. But 3 international student ministries at UT saw a need and responded. Mary Kay Horton with I-Navs hosted a beautiful baby shower for our friends at her home and, thankfully, both Bridges and RUF-I got to play a role in the celebration.
