Looking Back in Order to Think Ahead

In the last ten years we have seen some remarkable changes at First Presbyterian Church. We are no longer the small congregation that called me as pastor in 2016. In this time period the church has basically doubled in size, growing from a church of about 80 to a current membership of 161.

With record attendance and membership also comes record giving. Our church's giving has almost doubled in that same time frame. More importantly, our ministries have expanded in the areas of shepherding, discipleship, music, gospel missions, women's ministry, men's ministry, as well as children and youth discipleship. We have plans for even more.

With greater resources and greater ministry commitments has also come greater responsibility in maintaining our facilities. As a tool for ministry, our buildings and properties serve us well, but they also have to be maintained. The CEC was remodeled and several aspects of upkeep have been done to the main sanctuary building. Our new playground has also been a blessing to our families and neighborhood.

We have also seen a healthy transition in leadership. Some of our past elders have graduated to heaven while others have retired from faithful service. By God's grace we have a few new elders and a few new deacons with prospects for more additions to these important roles. As your pastor, I praise God that He continues to give us godly men to serve in shepherding and serving the body.

Change has come gradually but steadily in the last ten years. It is good to look back on some of these growth points so that we can look forward to what is next.

In January, our Financial Advisory Committee met to tweak our financial strategies. The newly formed building committee met to begin evaluating the needs for the expansion of our main building. The Session met for the first time in the new year to launch oversight of all these prongs of ministry. The Deacons are also hard at work caring for the congregation. Our Women's Ministry team also met to launch a new year of work. God has been so good to us!

In the days ahead, please remember to pray for our School of Music. There will be an outreach concert at the Art Circle Library on March 25th from noon to 1. This will be an exciting opportunity for our church to impact the community with the gospel through the gift of music. I hope you will plan to attend and support those on this team.

Finally, as we work to shape leaders and teams to reach and disciple new families, please pray for me and my fellow elders. We long to be a people transformed by the gospel. As we experience this transformation, may God be glorified in all things, that we might trust Him for all things, proclaim Him as King over all things, remembering to Love God and others through all things. Amen.

A Review of Andy's Latest/Newest Set of Reformed Expository Commentary Books

Does a title containing the word "commentary" make you think of a scholarly tome that may be much too wordy and difficult for you to navigate? Maybe something that would put you to sleep after reading a few pages? I think you might be surprised to discover that Pastor Andy has made a newer, even more relevant series available for checkout in the library. Editors Philip Ryken and Richard Phillips state that the series is intended for both pastors and lay readers, aiming to instruct and inspire Christians in a "joyful, obedient discipleship to Jesus Christ."

Wanting to see for myself, I picked up the book on *Philippians* since we had studied that very title in the spring session of the Women's Bible Study group and perused a few pages. I found the wording to be interesting, accessible, and very relatable. These books are certainly applicable to modern times. For example, I was reading a few pages concerning Paul's description of behavior that conflicts with the cross. The author further expands on this theme

by warning about the dangers of an earthbound mindset in linking happiness to consumption and "grabbing what you can now." He explains that "citizens of Heaven walk a different path, following the footsteps of Paul and his companions, to a different destination." He advises that it's perfectly okay to enjoy God's good gifts in this life as long as we don't idolize them and are willing to freely forego them if He so directs us to do so.

For anyone looking to undergo an even deeper study of God's word and how it should apply to our lives today, I recommend exploring these volumes.
